

1. Main Stages of Development

Origin and Establishment (1990s)

Following the acquisition of independence, Kazakhstan began to actively develop new Olympic sports. Beach volleyball emerged in the country in the early 1990s as a variation of classic volleyball. The initial competitions were primarily held in Almaty, on the Caspian Sea coast in Aktau, and in other major cities.

During this period, the first national tournaments were organized, regional teams were formed, and work commenced on training specialized coaches.

Formation of the National System (2000–2010)

In the early 2000s, the Volleyball Federation of the Republic of Kazakhstan designated beach volleyball as one of its priority development areas. The following initiatives were organized:

- Championships of the Republic of Kazakhstan;
- National Youth Championships;
- Training camps for national teams.

It was during this period that Kazakhstani athletes began to regularly compete in the Asian Championships and stages of the Asian Tour.

Reaching the International Level (2010–2020)

Over the next decade, Kazakhstan significantly strengthened its position in Asia.

The main training centers established were:

- Almaty;
- Aktau;
- Almaty Region.

National teams began to consistently rank among the strongest squads in Asia and regularly contended for medals in continental competitions.

Kazakhstani athletes became participants in:

- Asian Championships;
- Asian Beach Games;
- Asian Games;
- Stages of the Asian Beach Volleyball Tour;
- World tournaments under the auspices of the FIVB.

Contemporary Stage (2020–2026)

Recent years have witnessed a qualitative growth in the training level of athletes:

- The youth training system has improved;
- The geographic scope of competitions has expanded.

Special attention is dedicated to the development of the youth reserve, which is already yielding historic results on the Asian stage.

2. Key Achievements and Awards

Medals at the Asian Championships

Over many years, Kazakhstani athletes have repeatedly become medalists in Asian senior and youth competitions.

The most significant achievements include:

- **Gold Medals at the 2014 Asian Games** – Palembang, Indonesia (Men)
- **Gold Medals at the 2015 Asian Beach Games** – Da Nang, Vietnam (Women)
- **Gold Medals at the 2013 Asian Championships** – Wuhan, China (Men)
- **Silver Medals at the Asian Championships:**
 - Men: 2002 in Yingkou, China; 2006 on Kish Island, Iran; 2009 in Haikou, China; 2014 in Jinjiang, China
 - Women: 2010 in Haikou, China
- **Bronze Medals at the Asian Championships:**
 - Men: 2004 in Lianyungang, China; 2011 in Haikou, China; 2018 in Satun, Thailand
 - Women: 2013 in Wuhan, China

Participation in the Asian Games

The National Team of Kazakhstan regularly represents the country at the largest multi-sport competitions in Asia—the Asian Games. Participation in these competitions allows Kazakhstani athletes to gain valuable experience competing against the strongest teams on the continent, including:

- China;
- Qatar;
- Japan;
- Iran;
- Thailand;
- Indonesia.

Historic Gold at the Asian Youth Championship and Asian Youth Games

One of the most significant events in the history of Kazakhstani beach volleyball was the victory of the Kazakhstan Men's Youth Team at the 2025 Asian U21 Championship in Thailand.

The Kazakhstani duo of Klim Ryukhov and Vladislav Mastikhin won the youth Asian championship gold medals for the first time in the country's history, defeating the Chinese national team 2:0 in the final. Prior to this, Kazakhstan's best results had been limited to silver and bronze awards.

Additionally, gold medals at the Asian Youth Games were won by Alikhan Agabek and Sagynysh Orazaly, who defeated the team of Thailand 2:0 in the final. The women's team of Merey Kozhakhmet and Gayane Galash also secured bronze medals by defeating Malaysia 2:0 in the third-place match.

Significance of Achievements

These results confirm:

- The effectiveness of the coaching staff's work;
- The high level of preparation among young athletes;
- The promising prospects for Kazakhstan's further advancement to the global stage.
